AGAMI ANNUAL FUNDRAISER TO PROMOTE EDUCATION IN BANGLADESH

SANTA CLARA-(March 30, 2009) - Agami, a registered non-profit organization dedicated to bringing education to underprivileged children in Bangladesh will be hosting its annual fundraiser on May 30, 2009. The fundraiser will aim to raise funds for ongoing as well as upcoming projects. Ongoing projects include three new schools in Khulna as well as a girls' high school in Comilla and Madaripur. Two new projects to be launched in 2009 will aim to spread education to larger underprivileged areas throughout Bangladesh.

“The movie *Slumdog Millionaire* has given a face to the children of the slums and allowed the world to experience from the comfort of their own homes the lives of those in poverty,” states Dr. S Mahmudul Hassan, Vice President of Agami. “Education is the only tool that will bring the children of Bangladesh out of the darkness of poverty and into the bright future.”

The annual fundraiser will be an evening dedicated to empowering children through education and building for their futures. The event will include a delicious dinner followed by musical entertainment by Chandan and rock band Run for Cover. The event will be held at the TiE Center in Santa Clara at 6pm.
